Based in Warrenville, Ill., the company produces International® brand commercial trucks, mid-range diesel engines and IC brand school buses, and Workhorse brand chassis for motor homes and step vans. It is a private-label designer and manufacturer of diesel engines for the pickup truck, van and SUV markets. The company also provides truck and diesel engine parts and service.

The Alabama connection is that Navistar International built a diesel Engine Plant in Huntsville, Alabama. EMERGENCIES

1. Survey the scene. Check for potential danger.

5. Stay at the scene until emergency personnel arrive.

THE HISTORY OF THE LPGA

The Ladies Professional Golf Association is the longest-running women's sports association in the world, having celebrated its 60th anniversary in the year 2010. The organization has grown from its roots as a playing tour into a non-profit organization involved in every facet of golf. The LPGA Tour and the LPGA Teaching & Club Professional (T&CP) Membership comprise the backbone of what has become the premier women's sports organization in the world today. The LPGA maintains a strong focus on charity through: its tournaments; its grassroots junior and women's programs; its affiliation with the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation; and the formation of The LPGA Foundation. The LPGA is under the leadership of Michael Whan. The home office is base in Daytona, Florida.

This year, the LPGA Tour season will feature a minimum of 35 events with prize money of more than \$54 million. Players will compete for an average purse of \$1,596,617.

WOUNDED WARRIOR PROJECT

The Wounded Warrior Project is a nonprofit organization whose mission is to honor and empower wounded warriors of the United States Armed Forces. “ The Wounded Warrior Project (WWP) works to raise awareness and enlist the public’s aid for the needs of severely injured service men and women, to help severely injured service members aid and assist each other, and to provide unique direct programs and services to meet their needs.

The Wounded Warrior Project was founded in 2002 in Roanoke, Virginia by John Melia with assistance of family and friends. Melia had himself been severely wounded in a helicopter crash while serving in Somalia in 1992. In July 2006 WWP’s headquarters were moved from Roanoke to Jacksonville, Florida. WWP Founder John Melia cited a strong local veteran community, access to Jacksonville International Airport, and support from local business community, specifically the PGA Tour.

NAVISTAR LPGA CLASSIC FACTS

- The dates are October 4 - 10, 2010.
- The location is Capitol Hill, which is part of the nationally recognized Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail. Capitol Hill is located in Prattville, Alabama.
- The field of players consists of 144 professionals on the LPGA Tour competing for a purse of \$1,300,000.
- The Golf Channel will provide television coverage during all four rounds of play.
- The Navistar LPGA Classic Pro-Am will be held Wednesday, October 6th.

Clubhouse access is limited to LPGA players, LPGA officials, Navistar invited guests, and those with appropriate credentials.

SAFETY INFORMATION

One of our top priorities at the Navistar LPGA Classic is the safety of all attendees, players and volunteers.

As a volunteer you can be instrumental in keeping the tournament safe and enjoyable for everyone. As you perform your duties, we would like you to be aware of the conditions around you.

If you see something that does not seem right to you and you think it could lead to an accident, please report it to your committee chairman, security or tournament personnel immediately. We will do our best to correct any hazards.

SAFETY TIPS

- Drink plenty of fluids to avoid dehydration.
- Wear a hat for protection from the sun.
- Use suntan lotion or sun block.

Most volunteers will work outside with exposure to heat, cold, sun, wind and rain. Be prepared for any of these conditions. Layers of clothing work best. Remember your official Navistar LPGA Classic wind jacket when you are planning what to wear, as this will make your day more comfortable in the early mornings.

SECURITY

SPECTATOR TIPS

- Walk carefully, **NEVER** run

- Stay behind the gallery ropes and cooperate with the gallery control.
- Kneel or sit down if you are in the front row.
- Display your ticket at all times
- Designate a place to meet if you get separated from your companion(s).

WEATHER SUSPENSION GUIDELINES

Inclement Weather Policy:

Volunteers will be notified of an inclement weather delay by the on-course air horns and the electronic scoreboards. Once play has been suspended it is imperative that **all spectators evacuate the public bleachers and seek shelter immediately.**

During the delay a decision is made by the Rules Officials as to if and when play will resume. Actual play begins when the Rules Officials blow their on-course air horns.

Places Not to Go in a Weather Delay:

During any delay there are certain areas that need to be avoided. Please stay away from all metal structures (e.g. bleachers, skyboxes, villas). Do not go to high ground and stay away from all large trees.

In the event of severe weather, all volunteers should report to volunteer headquarters.

When play resumes, please return to your assigned post.

A suspension means there is a delay in play, not necessarily a cancellation.

VOLUNTEER CHECK-IN

Every volunteer must check-in at Volunteer Headquarters each day. This is an essential part of the volunteer process. If you do not check-in, there is a chance that your shift will not be verified. Each day at check-in, you will be given a complimentary meal voucher, along with final instructions. Please allow 15-20 minutes each day for parking and check-in. This is also the time to ask any necessary questions. **Volunteer Headquarters is on the left hand side of the cart barn that is located below the Clubhouse.**

VOLUNTEER CREDENTIALS

You must have your credentials with you to be admitted to the grounds. You must also have your volunteer parking pass to park in the volunteer lot.

VOLUNTEER GOLF VOUCHERS

We ask that you complete at least three (3) shifts to receive one (1) round of golf at Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail, Capitol Hill. The vouchers are good for one year and expire September 30, 2011. You may use your voucher any time except on weekends between the dates of February 13- May 16, 2011. You will receive a certificate and information following the tournament, *if you qualify*. A cart fee per person will be requested.

VOLUNTEER MEALS

Lunch is served 11:00 - 2:00 in Volunteer Headquarters. Volunteers will receive a meal voucher when they check in each morning and will redeem the voucher in VHQ during the lunch hours. Volunteers are encouraged to eat before or after their shifts. Breakfast is not guaranteed. It is provided for the volunteers reporting to work at 6:00 each morning.

VOLUNTEER PARKING

Volunteer Parking will be in Parking Lot B. This lot is located off the main drive into Capitol Hill. Signs will direct you as you approach the tournament. A shuttle will transport you to the clubhouse where Volunteer Headquarters is located. Please check-in at Volunteer Headquarters before EACH shift.

VOLUNTEER SMOKING POLICY

Volunteers should refrain from smoking while wearing a volunteer uniform. There will be a NO smoking policy while on duty. This includes riding a shuttle or golf cart. Volunteer Headquarters and the clubhouse will remain smoke free. **Consumption of alcoholic beverages is strictly prohibited while volunteering.*

VOLUNTEER UNIFORM

While on duty, volunteers will wear the uniform shirt and cap/visor. Volunteers will provide their own khaki pants or shorts. Additional shirts and jackets may be purchased in Volunteer Headquarters while supplies last.

MARSHALS RULES OF CONDUCT

- Always try to ensure an equal playing field for golfers.
- Never go near a ball in play except to protect an area outside the gallery ropes.
- Do not ask for autographs during tournament play.
- Never offer golf advice during tournament play.
- Stay off greens at all times.
- When off-duty, please remain outside the gallery ropes.
- Speak to players only if you have been spoken to.
- Direct your crowds in a polite, but forceful, manner (i.e. Quiet Please, Stand Please, and Off the Fairway Please).
- Be alert to adjacent areas so you do not disrupt play.
- If you are caught out of position while a shot is being played, stand still until play is completed.

STANDARD BEARERS

- Any questions you may have should be directed to your walking scorer.
- Always walk with your walking scorer
- Any questions you may have should be directed to your walking scorer.
- Always locate yourself even with the players and as far out as possible.
- Please record all score changes after your group has teed off on the next hole.
- Please do not speak while shots are being played.
- Prior to and while a shot is being played, remain still.
- Ride in a cart only when you are invited.

WALKING SCORERS CONDUCT

- Please walk as a group with any other markers or standard bearers.
- Please take responsibility for the standard bearer's location and etiquette.
- Walk up a particular side of the fairway or rough.
- Walk as close to the gallery ropes as possible.
- Prior to and while a shot is being played, remain still and quiet.
- If you are unsure of a score, please ask the player's caddie to verify the score.
- Report to your standard bearer any score changes upon completion of each hole.
- Please ensure that the standard is changed at the appropriate time.
- Only talk to the players when you are spoken to first.
- Never speak when play is in progress.
- If you need a drink on the tee box, please wait until your group has teed off.
